ROLES (6): Narrator 1, Narrator 2, Pig 1, Pig 2, Pig 3, Wolf

READER AGES: 6 years and over

PIG 1: What shall we do now?

PIG 2: We must each build ourselves a house.

PIG 3: How? We have nothing to build a house with.

PIG 2: Look at this strong pile of sticks! I will use them to build my house.


