

Each week in the newsletter our Creative Arts worker Gail has written a report outlining art activities with the Senior students. Middle school students are now part of this fantastic program. It was so good to be back making art in school and let's hope we can continue through the rest of the term with no more lockdowns!

This week we incorporated some science with our art activity using natural materials from the garden to make eco-prints. The students made designs with leaves, flowers and onion skins on some damp watercolour paper which was then

sandwiched with another piece of paper. This was then wrapped around a rusty tin can and tied up with string. At home I gradually warmed them up in a big pan of water for an hour and left them overnight to soak. What happens is that the oil in the leaves and the colours in the flowers and onion skins are released by the water and mix in with the iron oxides from the rust to form lovely patterns on the paper. It is a long process and the students will do the 'big reveal' of their eco-prints in class next week!

As we had lots of leaves to play with we also experimented with how we could make different art with them so we also had a great collection of wax rubbings and designs drawn directly on huge magnolia leaves.

I am excited to be able to take the creative worker program into the middle school this term and it was great to meet a whole new group of students. It's nice when you make art to be able to keep all your drawings and paintings together – even ones you don't really like! When you look back at them later you may have changed your mind and they can often light another creative spark. So the students were all given an art folio to organise their art and they decorated them in all sorts of designs and colours. We also had a way of deciding what to draw because when faced with a blank page, it can often be difficult to think of something! Our 'prompt' dice helped us – all we had to do was roll them and they suggested things for us such as 'draw your family' or 'your favourite lolly.' As always we had the records playing – this week the favourite was Queen's Greatest Hits – though one side of Saturday Night Fever did sneak in too!




















Room 8 have been getting up to some fun using the WOW word "When" - When I am 60. There sure is a lot of grey hair and beards in their futures !

The daffodils we planted a few weeks ago are starting to poke their shoots through and we'll soon have lots of lovely yellow flowers to brighten up the space. There are still plenty of herbs to pick, as well as spinach, lemons and limes.

One important job we did last week was to harvest all our lemon grass which grew magnificently this year! The students helped by digging up the plants which was a difficult job as the roots were quite deep. The long leaves were cut off, the



end roots replanted and it was all washed and bundled together to give away to staff and students – great work everyone!

As Spring is around the corner, the soil will start to gradually warm up so more seeds can be planted to get ready for summer produce. It will soon be time to plant our favourite sunflowers which put on such a great show last summer! In the meantime here are some jobs you may like to have a go at if you're in the garden:

- Stake up the broad beans before they get too heavy and fall over!
- Water the beds and seeds in the greenhouse
- Pull out any weeds you see
- And most importantly enjoy your produce !




Activities will include: Smoking ceremony, traditional art workshop, adventure camp activities and more!
