Our Commitment to Child Safety

Warragul & District Specialist School is committed to safety and wellbeing of all children and young people. This will be the primary focus of our care and decision-making. Warragul & District Specialist School has zero tolerance for child abuse.

Warragul & District Specialist School is committed to providing a child safe environment where children and young people are safe and feel safe, and their voices are heard about decisions that affect their lives. Particular attention will be paid to the safety of children with a disability as well the cultural safety of Aboriginal children and children from culturally and/or linguistically diverse backgrounds.

Every person involved in Warragul & District Specialist School has a responsibility to understand the important and specific role he/she plays individually and collectively to ensure that the wellbeing and safety of all children and young people is at the forefront of all they do and every decision they make.

The Victorian Government has invested \$1.5 million from the Recreational Fishing Licence Trust Fund to provide up to 95,000 Little Angler Kits to primary school aged children in Victoria.

This initiative aims to grow recreational fishing participation in Victoria by actively encouraging primary school aged children to learn how to fish, as well as learning more about marine life and the natural environment.

All WDSS students born from 2013 - 2018 are eligible to receive a FREE Little Angler Kit. Please contact the school by 20th March if you would like a kit. Please note: parents are required to pick up the kits from the school as they cannot go home on buses.

Any remaining kits will then be offered to older students.

Fishing kits should be stored securely at home in a place where children cannot access it, and children should be supervised by an adult when using the kit and when spending time around water. The kits include a rod, reel with line, tackle tray, some tackle and information on how to use them to catch a fish. Please note

that the tackle tray includes fishing hooks and lead sinkers. The tackle tray will be wrapped in cardboard and placed inside a pocket inside the fishing kit bag, which will be sealed with a cable tie to discourage students from opening their kits until they are with a parent or carer.

Seesaw

What is Seesaw?

Seesaw is an APP being introduced by WDSS this year. It will be used by our school staff to share student learning with families. It will also replace diary communication by allowing for direct communication with classroom staff.

Seesaw provides a safe and at times creative way for students to document their learning, while practicing digital literacy skills in a controlled environment.

Students will have an individual learning journal which staff will post to weekly.

How do I get Seesaw?

The Seesaw APP can be downloaded to any apple or android device from the store. Classroom teachers will soon send home some terms and conditions for use. When signed consent is received, classroom teachers will either send home a class code, text message or email for you to connect your child to the APP.

How often will teachers post?

Classroom teachers will post weekly learning experiences that your child is engaged in. Teacher will also check the Seesaw inbox daily for any communication between families and school. Important communication which is time sensitive (such as student changes to the bus) should still be communicated to the front office by phone as teachers will not check Seesaw while teaching.

I need help!

Your child's classroom teacher should be able to help with any questions you may have. Alternatively, you can drop into the office and ask to speak with Jade Nedic our Junior Unit Co-ordinator who will happily help connect you on the APP.

What do I do now?

To get started on Seesaw, you will need to return the signed consent form, download the Seesaw APP, and connect with your child's classroom. Once your connected, all you need to do is regularly check your child's learning journal to see all the amazing things happening in the classroom.
















Josh counted how many boys were present. Then, he identified the number on his ipad






Ryan says, "I am being supported to identify and group things that start with 'Ii'. Then I count them."


VET DSS Cert 2 in Workplace Skills


