

SENIORS

School Garden Program


A lovely sunny day welcomed us back to the school garden after the holidays! It was fantastic to see that all our hard work in the last few weeks is paying off - the raised beds which we filled with mushroom compost now have seedlings coming through – very exciting! We added to them by planting a few more peas and some broad beans which won't take long to come through at all.

As always there was maintenance to do and the students really got down to the task. This week we tackled the two olive trees which needed a good prune. The bigger branches were put in the rubbish bin but some of the smaller twigs were cut into smaller pieces for the compost heap. The olives are looking much better for their haircut!

We also took down the old netting around the edge of the garden which was put in to protect the fruit trees when they were first planted. This type of netting is not allowed to be used anymore as the mesh is too big and birds can get stuck in it.

Talking of birds....our family of friendly magpies were glad to see us back! One was next to me inside the greenhouse looking for worms and then all three of them serenaded me from the greenhouse roof as I had my lunch – what a lovely day!

Being **RESPECTFUL** and a good **LEARNER** and being a **LEARNER** during senior sport and passing the ball with staff and peers.


