

SCHOOL COUNCIL ELECTIONS 2024

All Government schools in Victoria have a School council. They are legally formed bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within centrally provided guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

There are three categories of membership:

Warragul & District

- A mandated Parent category. More than one third of the total members must be from this category. Department of Education and Training (DET) employees can be a parent member at their child's school as long as they are not employed at the school. However, these parents must be counted as DET members in the Council quorum.
- A mandated elected DET employee category. Members of this category may make up no
 more than one third of the total membership of school council. The principal of the school is
 automatically one of these members.
- An optional Community member category. Its members are co-opted by a decision of the council because of their special skills, interests or experiences.
- → The term of office is 2 years.
- Parent membership on school council can be a very fulfilling personal experience and satisfying and parents may also find that their children feel a greater sense of belonging.

There are 3 Parent School Council Members whose two year terms expire this year and any parent of a student attending WDSS is welcome to nominate for council.

Parent nominations can be made in two ways either by Self Nomination or Nomination by another Parent at Warragul & District Specialist School. Both forms are available at the office or contact the school and a form can be sent home.
