WE WANT OUR PARENTS/CARERS TO TELL US WHAT THEY THINK!

The Annual Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey will be conducted from Tuesday 16th August to Friday 16th September.

The Parent/Caregiver/Guardian Opinion Survey is an annual survey offered by the Department of Education and Training that is designed to assist schools in gaining an understanding of families' perceptions of school climate, student behaviour, and student engagement. Our school will use the survey results to help inform and direct future school planning and improvement strategies.

Families are randomly selected and will be invited via email to participate in the survey. You will be sent an email with a link to the survey. If you have a new email address, please phone the Office – 5623 1385.

The survey will be conducted online. It only takes 20 minutes to complete, and can be accessed at any convenient time within the fieldwork period on desktop computers, laptops, tablets or smartphones. The online survey will be available in a range of languages other than English. These include: Arabic, Vietnamese, Simplified Chinese, Chin (Hakha), Hindi, Japanese, Somali, Turkish, Punjabi and Greek.

The survey results will be shared in our newsletter. If you would like more information about the survey, please contact Matt for a chat.




Last weeks Wear your Words Day was a great day.

Positive Self-Talk

Often we can find ourselves in a position where we lack the motivation and confidence to perform tasks which may challenge us on many levels. Whilst an adult may be able to recognise this and adjust their approach, children can struggle with feelings of anger, frustration, even failure, resulting in low self-esteem and a reluctancy to try new things.


Positive self-talk is when you talk to yourself in a positive way. It is important because it helps children to perform at their best in challenging situations, having a greater impact on self-esteem, rational thinking, and general mood.

One of the simplest ways you can encourage your child to use positive self-talk at home, is to remind them of the thing they CAN do. A fun way for them to remember these things and practice when alone, is to make the "I Can" spinner. Simply cut out both the spinner topper and base, place the topper over the base and secure with a pin in the middle of the spinner. The topper will then spin around exposing some positive things your child CAN do. Ask them to give you an example of the "I Can" statement and watch their confidence grow!!

School Garden Program

Now all the beds are ready to be filled with lovely veggie mix so we can get our Spring planting underway!

Another job planned for last week (which was rained off) was sunflower planting so hopefully the weather will be kind on Thursday and we can get them in the ground.

The garden weaving frame is also being re-strung and it's about halfway done but it can still be used - just thread leaves, stems, grass and small twigs in and out of the strings.

We also did a few rubbish runs to keep the garden looking tidy - it's hard work emptying a wheelie bin into the skip but our students managed it!

In our art afternoon we gave the tealight holders another coat of paint and added the tealights. The cup and saucer bird feeders had glued together really well (thank goodness!) and we added some beads as a hanger. Now both the tealights and the feeders are ready to be sold at the Father's Day Stall!


