



They participated in the Basketball Victoria All Abilities Eco Cup Competition playing several schools including Baringa, Latrobe, Bass Coast and East Gippsland.


WDSS had three teams compete and it was fantastic to see the students work together and support each other during their games.

The Senior School would like to say a massive thank you to Ben and Dale from Warragul Warriors for their training and coaching before the competition and on the day.






















BOOK FAIR 2023
